3. General Rules of Conduct

All college students must adhere to the following rules and regulations for maintaining discipline:

1. College uniform is mandatory; casual wear is not allowed.
2. Girls must not wear precious jewellery or garments.
3. Use of mobile phones within college premises is strictly prohibited.
4. Entry and exit times are restricted during the academic session.
5. Students must carry and present their identity cards when demanded.
6. Permission from parents/guardians is required to leave the college during working hours.
7. Entry of outsiders/relatives without valid reasons is prohibited.
8. Unlawful assembly within college premises is banned.
9. Writing or posting bills on walls is a punishable offense.
10. Ragging in any form is strictly prohibited and can lead to legal consequences.
11. Misbehaviour or indiscipline may result in expulsion from college.
12. Formal application for admission cancellation requires parental approval.
13. Rules may be changed or amended by college authorities as and when required.
14. Weekly morning assembly will be held comprising of “moral thoughts” by some students and “announcements “by faculty.
15. Students must arrive by 9:45 am as the entry gate will close at 10:00 am sharp in summers.
16. Strict action will be taken for misconduct or breach of discipline.
17. Continuous absence for ten days will face severe consequences.
18. Roaming outside campus during college hours is not allowed.
19. Girls should not wear make-up and boys should also abstain from funky hair styles
20. Written permission (gate pass) is required to leave during working hours.
21. Smoking or use of tobacco is strictly prohibited in the campus.
22. Polythene use is strictly prohibited.
23. Students should not bring distracting items or personal entertainment devices.
24. Students are responsible for college property and must maintain cleanliness.
25. Abusive language is not permitted in or around the college.
26. Proper uniform is required for entry into the examination hall.

Note: Non-compliance with rules of the college can be penalized by the imposition of fines and/or appropriate disciplinary action as the committee deems fit.

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6. Admission Policy/ Procedure (NEP 2020)

Under NEP 2020, colleges in Jammu and Kashmir (J&K) have the following admission procedure:

- **Common Entrance Exams:** NEP 2020 promotes common entrance exams for college admissions. J&K may establish or participate in these exams at the state or national level.
- **Eligibility Criteria:** Each college sets its own eligibility criteria, including academic qualifications, grades in qualifying exams, subject requirements, and additional criteria.
- **Application Process:** Students must follow the designated application process, including form submission, document provision, and fee payment.
- **Merit-based or Counselling-based Admissions:** Colleges use merit-based or counselling-based admissions, considering entrance exam or qualifying exam performance.
- **Reservation Policies:** J&K follows reservation policies, with quotas for various social groups like SC, ST, OBC, EWS, as determined by the state government.

Note: Detailed procedures, entrance exams, and criteria are announced by authorities. Students should check **college websites or Telegram Chanel or www.jkadmission.samarth.ac.in** for updates and guidelines.

The admission to under-graduate courses is offered strictly in accordance with the statutes laid down by the University of Kashmir and the guidelines set by Higher Education Department of J&K from time to time. The admission process for B.A/B.Sc./B.Com/B.Sc.-IT for 1st /2nd semester usually starts within a fortnight after the declaration of result by National Testing Agency (NTA). The following rules/regulations govern the admission policy:

- ❖ All those candidates who have qualified CUET 2023 conducted by National Testing Agency (NTA).
- ❖ The Common University Entrance Test (CUET (UG) -2023) is being introduced for admission into all UG Programmes in all Central Universities for academic session 2023-24 under the ministry of Education (MoE). The Common University Test (CUET) provides a common platform and equal opportunities to candidates across the country, especially those from rural and other remote areas and help establish better connect with the Universities. A single examination will enable the Candidate to cover a wide outreach and be a part of admissions process to various Central Universities.
- ❖ Candidates whose result is declared late by National Testing Agency (NTA) ,are eligible to formalize their admission against a non-refundable admission fee of Rs. 100 on the terms and conditions as per University rules and availability of seats in the college.
- ❖ Candidates who have a break in their academic career can be considered for admission under rules set by the Kashmir University.
- ❖ The candidate has to submit his/her admission form personally in the admission section of the College along with following documents:
 - ✓ CUET 2023 Score Card issued by National Testing Agency (NTA).
 - ✓ Provisional and Character Certificates (In Original)
 - ✓ Marks sheet of 12th class (Original + two Photostat copies)
 - ✓ Date of Birth Certificate/Qualification Certificate of 10th class. (Two Photostat copies)
 - ✓ Transfer/Migration Certificate, in case, the candidate has passed the 12th class examination from other than JKBOSE.
 - ✓ Two passport size photographs.
 - ✓ (If Applicable) Orphan/ Physically Handicapped certificate issued by competent authority.

- ❖ The candidates are required to keep original of all the testimonials with them during the admission process.
- ❖ The candidate shall be enrolled in the College only after depositing the prescribed fee in full.

In their own interest prospective students are advised to go through prospectus thoroughly before filling the admission form. After a counseling session with members of admission committee, the students are advised to carefully select one subject combination offered and apply for the same. Subject combination once offered shall under no circumstance be changed later on. The Principal reserves the right to accept or reject any application form for admission without assigning any reason.

The Library provides students with ample workspace, a calm setting, and a convenient location. Library visitors utilize the library to access reading material in print or electronic form; they can work on group projects, complete assignments, and use library for research purposes. The library houses more than eleven thousand manuscripts. The collection is built to meet the present or anticipatory demands of the students as well as teachers. The collection primarily consists of materials related to the college curriculum. The library has separate text section, reference section, reading area, and magazine section.

The services provided by library include, access to text collection, reference materials, magazine collection, newspapers and electronic materials. The library also has browsing facility for students to surf the internet. Additionally, Online Public Access Catalogue (OPAC) is made accessible through KIOSK. The library also has reprographic service for the students and teachers. The students can also register for access to NLIST (National Library and Information Services Infrastructure for Scholarly Content). NLIST is a programme funded by the MHRD under NME-ICT to extend access to selected e-resources The N-

LIST covers all the disciplines viz. Pure Sciences, Social Sciences and Humanities including Linguistics and Languages.

Library Rules and Regulations:

1. All library users must store their bags and belongings in the provided rack at the entrance. The library is not responsible for any lost or stolen items.
2. Return books to the nearest book-table after use. Do not attempt to reshelv them yourself.
3. Fold and return newspapers/magazines to their designated location after reading.
4. Students and professors should not loan books issued in their names to others.
5. Before registering for a new semester, all borrowed books must be returned.
6. Maintain silence in the library to preserve the atmosphere.
7. Keep mobile devices turned off or on silent mode inside the library.
8. Food and beverages are not allowed in the library.
9. The library has the right to recall any borrowed book/item at any time.
10. Books can be borrowed for 15 days only. A fine of Re 1 per day applies thereafter.
11. Books can be renewed once if not in demand. If another user requests the same book, it may be recalled.
12. Any loss, damage or destruction of documents will result in consequences such as suspension of membership and replacement of the affected material.
13. Photocopying services are available for library books/documents and can be collected after 2 PM on the next working day.
14. Reprographic services are only available for students and limited to library books/documents.

8. Scholarship and Financial Assistance

The college facilitates grant of scholarships to the students of different categories. It facilitates Post-Matric scholarship belonging to minority communities, Merit-cum-Means scholarship awarded by the Govt. through Social Welfare Department and National Merit Scholarship for the students who obtained 80% or above marks in their qualifying examinations, Bad Pocket scholarships for the students hailing from backward areas through Higher Education Department. To render a helping hand to students under orphan, physically challenged and AAY, college provides a reasonable amount for scholarship from the college local fund. The process of selection is announced well in advance and the payment is credited directly into their bank accounts under DBT (Direct Benefit Transfer).

Pradhan Mantri Uchchatar Shiksha Protsahan (PM-USP) Yojana for J&K students only is centrally sponsored Scheme run by All India Council for

Technical Education (AICTE), New Delhi. AICTE is a wing of Ministry for Human Resource Development, Govt. of India. From 2018, GDC Pattan provides facilitation under I.D. No. FK20180007. AICTE provides scholarship to students on Merit basis in the courses like Medical, Engineering and other streams admitted in various colleges all over India.

9. Admission/Career Counseling and Placement Cell

This cell offers an Induction Program for 1st semester students, Placement assistance for 6th semester students, and psychological counseling for all students. It provides valuable guidance to help students choose their future field and maximize their potential. The cell stays updated on global employment trends and arranges extension lectures on communication and employability to enhance overall personalities. It conducts training programs on personality development, confidence building, time management, and interpersonal skills for facing interviews. The cell offers personal, vocational, and career counseling on an individual basis, as well as guidance for competitive examinations.

10.Sports Facilities

Our college prioritizes the overall development of learners, emphasizing both academics and sports. We provide facilities for various sports such as Cricket, Football, Hockey, Volleyball, Table Tennis, Badminton, Chess, Kabbadi, Carrom, Kho Kho, Adventure Sports, Athletics, and Aquatics. Students are encouraged to participate in sports at college, university, and even national levels. Selection for college teams is done through rigorous trials, and participants receive necessary support like uniforms, equipment, travel allowance, and refreshments during tournaments. Outstanding performers are recognized on the sports annual day. The Department of Physical Education and Sports, supported by the Sports Committee, manages teams for Cricket, Kabbadi, Volleyball and athletics.

11.Student Grievance Cell

12.Redressal of Gender Issues
